D. AUTHORIZATION TO APPLY FOR AND ACCEPT THE 2021 SAFETY GRANT PROGRAM IN THE AMOUNT OF \$39,917

Explanation:

New Jersey Schools Insurance Group has established a Safety Grant Program which is projected to award over \$1,000,000 to its member New Jersey public school districts in 2021. The Safety Grant Program is designed to help members make safety, security and educational related purchases toward loss prevention at the individual district level which ultimately affects the health of the overall ERIC NORTH Sub fund. The district will be applying for funds to upgrade our security cameras, create smart plans of our buildings, and replace generators.
