## D. APPROVAL TO SUSPEND ACTIVITY ON PISCATAWAY HIGH SCHOOL EXTERIOR METAL PANELS REPLACEMENT PROJECT

#### Explanation:

In December 2013 the Piscataway Township Board of Education received approval from the New Jersey Schools Development Authority (SDA) for Regular Operating District (ROD) grant funding for the Piscataway High School Exterior Metal Panel Replacement project. The approved total project cost was \$1,542,000 with a local share allocation of \$925,200 and a state share allocation of \$616,800. The original

intention of the project was to address water infiltration and insulation issues in the Susan B. Anthony portion of PHS. Over the years, the District has explored the feasibility of completing this project with price estimates ranging up to \$5 million. In the meantime, the District has addressed the water infiltration issues by identifying and remediating other points of entry into the building. Based on the escalating project cost and the minimal incremental value of replacing the panels, it is the recommendation of District Administration and the Fiscal Planning and Operations Committee that the project be suspended and closed.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Piscataway Township Board of Education suspends further activity on the Piscataway High School exterior metal panels replacement project (DOE Project #4130-050-13-2026 and SDA Project #4130-050-13-G1WE); and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Piscataway Township Board of Education authorizes the Business Administrator to submit existing expenditures to the New Jersey Schools Development Authority for reimbursement and to complete all necessary paperwork to close the project.

 AUTHORIZATION FOR STAFF MEMBERS TO ATTEND THE NEW JERSEY CONSORTIA FOR EXCELLENCE THROUGH EQUITY – CENTRAL REGION WORKSHOPS

#### Explanation:

As part of our membership in the New Jersey Consortia for Excellence through Equity – Central Region, the Piscataway Township School District is authorized to have staff members attend a series of workshops related to student achievement. Up to ten staff members may attend each workshop.

#### Explanation:

Under the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Act of 2006, when a grantee requires an amendment to approved funding that exceeds 10%, re-approval must be obtained by the Board of Education. The amount of the grant did not change. We are just re-allocating funds; this funding will continue to provide financial support to career and technical education programs during academic school year 2022-2023 for our high school students.

E. APPROVAL OF PISCATAWAY HIGH SCHOOL WORLD LANGUAGE STUDENT TRIP TO QUEBEC, CANADA

#### Explanation:

The World Language Department at Piscataway High School is requesting approval for a winter trip to Quebec City, Quebec, Canada. Students from French classes will spend four days, February 17-20, 2023, on a cultural and immersion trip to places of historical and cultural significance, while having the opportunity to speak French. Mrs. Sylvia Guensch and Mrs. Maria Whiteman will plan and chaperone the trip, which occurs over President's Day weekend, with students missing one day of instructional time. Cost per student will range from \$948-\$1162, depending on the number of participants.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Piscataway Township Board of Education approves the Piscataway High School World Language Department trip to Quebec, Canada from February 17-20, 2023.

#### F. APPROVAL OF CONTRACT SERVICES WITH LEXIA LEARNING SYSTEMS

### Explanation:

The LETRS® (Language Essentials for Teachers of Reading and Spelling) Suite is comprehensive professional learning designed to provide early childhood and elementary educators and administrators with deep knowledge to be literacy and language experts in the science of reading. LETRS teaches the skills needed to master the foundational and fundamentals of reading and writing instruction—phonological awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary, comprehension, and written language. The LETRS Suite Supports Effective Professional Learning in a modern, blended approach with the availability of digital and print resources and professional learning practice to meet staff development needs.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Piscataway Township Board of Education approves contracted services with Lexia Learning Systems for LETRS for the K-8 schools to be used for the 2022-2023 school year at a cost not to exceed \$22,000.

#### G. APPROVAL OF CONTRACT FOR LEXIA LEARNING SYSTEMS WITH TITLE I FUNDS

#### Explanation:

Lexia Power Up is an online platform designed to help struggling readers in Grades 6 and up become proficient readers and confident learners. The program simultaneously addresses gaps in fundamental literacy skills while helping students to build higher-level skills they need to comprehend, analyze, evaluate and compare complex texts. Power Up combines online student-driven explicit instruction with offline teacher-delivered lessons and activities. The blended learning experience will benefit students who respond to a combination of instructional strategies.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Piscataway Township Board of Education approves a contract with Lexia Learning Systems in accordance with terms and agreement on file in the office to the Board Secretary at a cost of \$7,000.

#### H. APPROVAL OF CONTRACT WITH EXPLORE LEARNING GIZMOS WITH TITLE I FUNDS

#### Explanation:

ExploreLearning Gizmos is a web-based project learning application for science simulations and experiments. Gizmos are interactive simulations that allow students to enter and manipulate different variables within a simulation, experiment, or visualization. This program allows teachers to enhance student discovery-based learning in alignment with the NGSS (NJSLS-Science) curriculum. ExploreLearning Gizmos will be used within the middle schools.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Piscataway Township Board of Education approves a contract with ExploreLearning Gizmos in accordance with terms and agreement on file in the office of the Board Secretary at a cost of \$13,800.

#### APPROVAL OF CONTRACT WITH NEW JERSEY PERFORMING ARTS CENTER (NJPAC)

#### Explanation:

This third through twelfth grade dance/theatre residency program includes the implementation of the Storytelling Through Dance (Grade 3), Storytelling Through Drama (Grade 5), Hip Hop (Grades 6-8), and Musical Theatre FUNdamentals (Grades 10-12) curriculum by New Jersey Performing Arts Center teaching artists. Select students will participate in instructional sessions of the NJPAC curriculum aligned to the New Jersey Core Curriculum Content Standards for Visual and Performing Arts.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Piscataway Township Board of Education approves the following contracted services grant for New Jersey Performing Arts Center (NJPAC) to provide a dance/theatre program to selected third through twelfth grade students during the 2022-2023 school year in the amount of \$15,600.00 (funded by Piscataway Township Schools).

#### J. APPROVAL OF CONTRACT WITH TURNITIN

#### Explanation:

Turnitin is an internet-based plagiarism detection service and has been the primary resource for our English Department in grades 9 through 12 for almost 10 years. The resource is being recommended for a 3 year purchase to extend our use of the program.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Piscataway Township Board of Education approves a contract with Turnitin for three years at a cost of \$27,802.65 in accordance with the terms and agreement on file in the office of the Board Secretary.

## E. RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF CHANGES TO THE SCHOOL EMPLOYEES HEALTH BENEFIT PROGRAM AND CHAPTER 44

WHEREAS, the School Employees Health Benefits Program (SEHBP), governed by *N.J.S.A.* 52:14-17.46 et seq., offers medical, prescription drug, and dental coverage to participating school district employees, retirees, and eligible dependents; and

WHEREAS, all SEHBP plans are self-funded, meaning that the money paid out for benefits comes directly from an SEHBP fund supplied by participating local employers and member premiums; and

WHEREAS, the Division of Pensions and Benefits is responsible for the daily administrative activities of the SEHPB, the School Employees Health Benefits Commission is the executive organization responsible for overseeing the SEHBP; and

WHEREAS, the School Employees Health Benefits Commission, comprised of state officials, union representatives and a representative of the New Jersey School Boards Association, annually considers the calendar year premium levels for the Local Education Employee Group of the SEHBP based on recommendations found in the Rate Setting Recommendation Analysis of the Local Education Employee Group; and

WHEREAS, the School Employees' Health Benefits Plan Design Committee has the responsibility for and authority over the various plans and components of the plans, including for medical benefits, prescription benefits, dental, vision, and any other health care benefits, offered and administered by the SEHBP; and

WHEREAS, existing law requires three members of the School Employees' Health Benefits Plan Design Committee to be appointed by the Governor as representatives of public employers (i.e., local school districts) whose employees are enrolled in the program, but currently all such representatives are state-level appointees;

WHEREAS, since employees enrolled the NJEHP pay a percentage of salary toward their health benefits per P.L.2020, c.44, commonly referred to as "Chapter 44", any increase in NJEHP premiums will fall almost entirely upon local boards of education, placing a severe strain on their budgets; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Piscataway Township Board of Education in the county of Middlesex urge the Legislature to adopt legislation expanding the composition of the School Employees Health

Benefits Commission and the School Employees' Health Benefits Plan Design Committee to include additional representatives from local school district management; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Piscataway Township Board of Education in the county of Middlesex urge the Legislature and executive branch to examine the impact that "Chapter 44" has had on school district budgets and to adopt legislation that will reverse any of its negative consequences and provide relief to those districts; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to Governor Phil Murphy, State Treasurer Elizabeth Muoio, Senate President Nicholas Scutari, Assembly Speaker Craig Coughlin, Senator Bob Smith, Assemblyman Joe Danielsen, Assemblyman Joseph Egan, and the New Jersey School Boards Association.
