

Policy / Legislative

The Policy/Legislative Committee met on Aug. 2, 2023, to discuss proposed policies regarding weapons, threat-as-sessment teams, and transgender students, and more.

- The Committee unanimously approved adding language to Policy 8467 (Weapons) prohibiting law enforcement officers from other jurisdictions from carrying weapons on school grounds or at school-sponsored events they are attending as parents or community members. This amendment was based on guidance from the Piscataway Township Police Department. The revised policy will be placed on the Board agenda.
- The Committee unanimously approved proposed Policy 2419 (School Threat Assessment Teams) for placement on the Board agenda. The policy would implement State law requiring multi-disciplinary teams in each school to identify students who may pose a threat of violence, and to provide resources to support them and maintain a safe school environment. Ms. Corradino sought assurances that these teams would apply appropriate criteria to identify students who do in fact pose a risk. Ms. Smith also encouraged the Administration to monitor the activities of these teams to assure that students are not being singled out unfairly.
- The Committee unanimously approved an update to Policy 5746 (Transgender Students) to be placed on the Board agenda. It would align with State Department of Education guidance on districts' duty of accommodation for transgender students.
- Mr. Rubin briefed the Committee on a recent amendment to the sick leave statute, drastically expanding the list of reasons eligible for use of sick days aside from illness. The Committee shared questions and concerns about the potential effect on absenteeism and future labor negotiations, and urged the Administration to collect data on sick day usage.

Curriculum

The Curriculum Committee met on Aug. 7, 2023, to discuss curriculum updates and adopt new textbooks.

Curriculum Design Approval
