C. APPROVAL OF FOOD SERVICE PROGRAM MEAL PRICES FOR 2024-2025

*Explanation:*

*Lunch prices in our cafeterias have not increased since 2012-2013. The Fiscal Planning and Operations Committee reviewed an analysis of lunch prices in surrounding districts and Piscataway is \$0.57 below the average price. To offset inflationary increases in food costs and to ensure that the food service management company can provide quality lunches for our students, it is recommended that lunch prices are increased \$0.50. This increase will not impact students eligible for free or reduced price meals. Breakfast prices will remain unchanged.*

D. AWARD OF PROFESSIONAL SERVICES CONTRACT: ARCHITECT

1. BE IT RESOLVED that the Piscataway Township Board of Education enters into a professional services contract pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-5a(1) with Spiezle Architectural Group for architectural and engineering services for acoustical evaluations at Piscataway High School and Fellowship Farms School for a lump sum fee of \$13,900.00 plus reimbursable expenses.
2. BE IT RESOLVED that the Piscataway Township Board of Education enters into a professional services contract pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-5a(1) with Spiezle Architectural Group for architectural and engineering services to assess options for renovating the existing Media Center at Piscataway High School and incorporating a new E-sports room for a lump sum fee of \$12,500.00 plus reimbursable expenses.
3. BE IT RESOLVED that the Piscataway Township Board of Education enters into a professional services contract pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-5a(1) with Spiezle Architectural Group for architectural and civil/site engineering services for paving upgrade projects at multiple schools for a lump sum fee of \$63,500.00 plus reimbursable expenses.

E. AUTHORIZATION TO WITHDRAW FROM CAPITAL RESERVE

Explanation:

The Piscataway Township Board of Education has established a capital reserve account to implement capital projects in the school district’s long range facilities plan. In accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-14.1(h), the Board must approve the withdrawal of funds from capital reserve to fund certain costs associated with capital projects.

WHEREAS, the Piscataway Township Board of Education has authorized Spiezle Architectural Group to perform architectural and engineering services for paving upgrade projects at multiple schools; and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-14.1(h)1 allows for the withdrawal of funds from capital reserve by board resolution to fund pre-development or other pre-application costs;

- A. AUTHORIZATION TO REAPPLY AND ACCEPT THE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOL EMERGENCY RELIEF FUNDS – HOMELESS CHILDREN AND YOUTHS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,698

*Explanation:*

*The Piscataway Township Board of Education received notification of its eligibility to apply/accept for additional funding from the American Rescue Plan Elementary and Secondary Schools Emergency Relief Fund – Homeless Children and Youths (ARP-HCY II). The purpose of this relief is to identify homeless children and youths, provide wraparound services that address the multiple effects of the COVID-19 pandemic on homeless children and youth, and ensure that homeless children and youth are able to attend school and participate fully in school activities.*

BE IT RESOLVED that the Piscataway Township Board of Education authorizes the Superintendent to apply for and accept the American Rescue Plan Elementary and Secondary Schools Emergency Relief Fund – Homeless Children and Youths in the amount of \$1,698, the total of the allocation being \$34,332.

- B. AUTHORIZATION TO APPLY FOR THE EXPANDING ACCESS TO CLIMATE CHANGE COMPETITIVE GRANT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$31,875

*Explanation:*

The Piscataway Township Board of Education has received notification of its eligibility to apply for the Expanding Access to Climate Change Education and the New Jersey Student Learning Standards through Interdisciplinary Learning and Community Resilience Compleitive Grant. The purpose of this competitive grant opportunity is to expand equitable access to high-quality, standards-based climate change education for K – 12 students, encourage the development of student-centered learning opportunities, and increase engagement in location-based climate change education.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Piscataway Township Board of Education authorizes the Superintendent to apply for the Expanding Access to Climate Change Competitive Grant funding in the amount of \$31,875 for the project period of June 1, 2024 through May 31, 2025.

**C. APPROVAL TO ACCEPT THE AWARD FOR THE PRESCHOOL FACILITIES EXPANSION GRANT**

*Explanation:*

*Under the Preschool Facilities Expansion program, regular operating districts (ROD) are eligible to receive at a minimum 40 percent of approved eligible project costs. Submission was accepted for the Preschool Addition at Dwight D. Eisenhower Elementary School from the New Jersey Department of Education.*

BE IT RESOLVED that the Piscataway Township Board of Education authorizes the Superintendent to accept the Preschool Facilities Expansion Grant in the amount of \$4,199,000.
