Transition Program

The SAIL program is a life skills program for autistic, developmentally and cognitively impaired students from ages 18-21. The SAIL Program is designed to introduce students with disabilities to workplace skills while beginning the process of transitioning to adult life. Students develop workplace preparedness and functional life skills through activities inside and outside the classroom. Students are exposed to a variety of occupations via hands on experiences, employment oriented trips and job shadowing. Career inventories and formative assessments are utilized to determine areas of interest and

strengths to choose appropriate work study placements.

Curriculum

The SAIL program provides integrated functional academic, vocations, and physical education to support the transition of learners from a traditional school environment to adult life. Each school day involves both classroom and workplace experiences. Course work addresses domestic life skills. vocational skills and recreation and leisure. The curriculum includes travel training, social skills, ADA, OSHA and job safety training. Related services including speech, occupational and physical therapy are available per a student's IEP.

Workplace Sites

The SAIL program provides invaluable training and experience to prepare students for the workplace. They

acquire relevant skills which enable them to become responsible members of our community.

We partner with local businesses to provide students with work experience. Students have the opportunity to train at multiple diverse jobs sites over the course of the program in order to discover areas of interest and acquire a variety of job skills. Some students shadow employees, some work hand in hand with a job coach and some work independently based on theirs strengths and needs.
