VII. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

HEALTH LINKS INTERNS LEARN THROUGH HANDS-ON EXPERIENCES

Piscataway Health Links interns – 44 students from all three middle schools who have shown strong interest in the Health Sciences – continued their health education in January with visits to the Robert Woods Johnson Foundation and the Liberty Science Center Live from Surgery, where they viewed a video of a kidney transplant, spoke to a transplant team, and examined surgical instruments first-hand. This visit furthered the education received during their November visit to the Sharing Network, the largest organ procurement organization in New Jersey. There the students learned about the importance of organ donation and were honored to meet a heart and liver transplant recipient. They were deeply moved by the presentation and look forward to spreading the word about how ordinary people can be heroes by making the decision to become organ donors.

HOGWORTS COMES ALIVE AT ARBOR

At Arbor school, students in Rooms 34 and 36 journey to Hogwarts as Harry Potter Book Club members. Teachers and avid Harry Potter fans Meaghan Brandt and Meredith Cantwell began the club after noticing students' increasing interest in the series. During club meetings, students and teachers read and discuss story elements including characters, plot, and foreshadowing, followed by activities such as wand and broom making, sorting hat ceremonies, and the up and coming Quidditch team tryouts. Students have a chance to earn House points toward the House Cup for their individual hard work as well as teamwork. Students reluctantly return to the Muggle world once club time is over, and look forward to their next trip to Hogworts!

KNOLLWOOD ART OF SCIENCE SCIENCEEXPLORES

Knollwood First Graders are exploring the world of science using their senses. In studying their Sound and Light Units, the students designed and created musical instruments, created sound waves using tuning forks and participated in a Listening Walk. They experimented with different sources of light and adventured through the darkness. Students formed hypothesis prior to investigations and compared their results with their predictions using a broad array of content areas.

PHS AWARDED BREAKFAST KIOSK FROM PEPSICO AND THE DAIRY COUNCIL

Pepsico and the National Dairy Council named Piscataway High School one of two winners of its Breakfast Kiosk grant. This means that PHS receives a \$10,000 Breakfast Kiosk to help ensure kids on the run begin their day with a healthy meal. Kids can "grab-and-go" — a proven way to get more kids to eat breakfast. PHS STUDENTS HONOR BLACK HISTORY MONTH WITH LIVESTREAM TO GHANA

Throughout February, Piscataway School honors Black History Month with special programs, events, and instruction across all grade levels. At PHS on February 16, selected students will participate in the livestreamed Ghana teleconference, a cultural exchange facilitated by Oiada International, a non-profit organization that connects schools around the world in distance learning programs. Our students will interact with students from Ghana, learning about their cultures, traditions, and history while sharing their own heritage and history. PHS choir students will share musical selections with Black History Month themes, while Ghana students reciprocate with their own traditional music. Programs such as this offer opportunities for students to develop understanding, knowledge, and skills in our global society.

SIXTH GRADERS ACROSS THE DISTRICT GET "DANCE POWER"

This year, Dance Power, our partnership with the American Repertory Ballet/Princeton Ballet School as part of LEAP (Local Enriched Academic/Arts Program) for students in grades two through five, was extended to sixth graders as part of their physical education class. Dance Power is designed to support cross-subject learning, and all five of New Jersey's Core Curriculum Content Standards for Dance are integrated into weekly lesson plans. Every sixth grader in the district participated and family and friends were invited to a high-energy performance following the unit's completion.

PHS PRESENTS DAMN YANKEES

PHS will present *Damn Yankees* as this year's musical on Thursday, March 1 and Friday, March 2 at 7PM, and Saturday, March 3 at 2PM and 7PM in the PHS PAC. The original production of Damn Yankees won seven Tony Awards, including Best Musical. This wicked, romantic comedy features all-American subject matter and an irreverent sense of humor. SCHOOL BIRTHDAY COOKIE TRAYS NOW AVAILABLE FOR CELEBRATIONS

Working parents will appreciate a new *Birthday Celebration Cookie Tray* available through Sodexo Food Services for \$25. Order anytime throughout the year up to two weeks before a child's birthday, and a tray of cookies and bottled water for every student in the class, and a party hat for the birthday student, will be delivered to your child's classroom on his/her special day. No worries about allergies or getting to work on time. Order forms are available at each school and will be on the district and school websites soon.

QUIBBLETOWN AUXILIARY GYM OFFERS STRENGTH AND ENDURANCE TRAINING FOR ALL STUDENTS

The Quibbletown auxiliary gym has become a highlight of the PE cycle for all Quibbletown students. All students take classes in the auxiliary gym for two weeks in every six week period. The goal is to increase each student's muscular strength, muscular endurance, and flexibility. Students began with simple strength training equipment (balance balls, bosu balls, aerobic bars, strength bands) and graduated to more advanced items (plyometric boxes & kettlebells). In the last few years, students began working with pull-up and dip bars and TRX suspension straps. The position of the room also allows for easy access to the outdoor fitness trail.

GRANDVIEW STEM NIGHT

Grandview students learned the Engineering Design Process first hand, helping the Gingerbread Man build a boat to cross the river without sinking at Grandview STEM Night. Students constructed a plan, designed a model, and built their design from given materials. They tested their product and then planned improvements.

RANDOLPHVILLE SECOND GRADERS TAKE A "SEAT"

Randolphville second grade teachers Mrs. Tracie Toke, Mrs. Jamie Mayer, and Mrs. Carol Cirasa have introduced flexible seating options to their students as they work and learn. The children enjoy reading while lounging on cushions, writing while sitting on exercise balls, or completing a math activity while rocking their feet on a "Swidget." Teachers report greater student engagement, participation, and collaboration.

KNOLLWOOD WORD PROBLEM WALKS

Knollwood third graders learn multiplication on "3rd Grade Winter Word Problem Walks." The students wrote, solved, and illustrated multi-step word problems incorporating student interests, current events, and real-life scenarios where students might need to use their multiplication skills, applying multiplication strategies learned in class to solve each problem. Teachers, friends, parents, and administrators enjoyed walking through the hallways, solving word problems and specifying their methodologies.

MICHAEL PETITE SETS PHS WRESTLING RECORD

Michael Petite set a record as the winningest wrestler in PHS history when he recorded a second-period pin in the Chiefs' Group V quarterfinal victory over Bayonne on February 5. E. AUTHORIZATION TO WITHDRAW FROM CAPITAL RESERVE

Explanation:

On January 25, 2018, the Board approved El Associates as the architect for the Grandview Elementary School four classroom addition and the Piscataway High School synthetic turf field replacement and tennis courts, track, pavement and sidewalk repairs project. In accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-14.1(h)1, the Board must approve the withdrawal of funds from capital reserve to fund pre-development or other pre-application costs.

WHEREAS, the Piscataway Township Board of Education has authorized the submission of the Grandview Elementary School four classroom addition and the Piscataway High School synthetic turf field replacement and tennis courts, track, pavement and sidewalk repairs project to the New Jersey Department of Education for approval as other capital projects consistent with the District's long-range facilities plan; and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-14.1(h)1 allows for the withdrawal of funds from capital reserve by board resolution to fund pre-development or other pre-application costs;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Piscataway Township Board of Education authorizes the Business Administrator to withdraw \$326,000 from capital reserve to fund the pre-development or other pre-application costs for the Grandview Elementary School four classroom addition and the Piscataway High School synthetic turf field replacement and tennis courts, track, pavement and sidewalk repairs project.
