VII. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

PHS FILMMAKING STUDENTS RISE TO THE TOP

PHS Television Broadcasting & Digital Filmmaking students made the top 10 USA finalists in the Panasonic Kid Witness News competition. With 553 schools worldwide in 19 countries competing, our students explored "The World through Their Eyes." Using our state-of-the-art, high definition equipment, PHS students earned top spots for one Public Service Announcement, "D.A.B. Destroy All Bacteria" and one Human Interest story, "Snap Judgement." The top 10 videos from each video category will be judged by a group of industry VIPs, with the winners representing the USA in international competition. More good news for PHS film students came from the Ten Day Film Challenge, where our students scored three films in the top 30 from over 150 entries. The awards are on April 13 at Regal Cinema in Burlington, NJ. Congratulations to teachers Susan Pascullo and Brittany Bickerton, Practical Arts Department Chair Tom Wolverton, and their award-winning students!

QUIBBLETOWN STUDENTS GET MEDIA TECH SAVVY

Quibbletown seventh graders in Media Tech finished their Olympic Unit, where they first researched countries that participated in the Winter Olympics and created a travel brochure. Next, they competed in groups. They selected and researched an Olympian and developed an interview. Then, using their iPads and Quibbletown's new Green Screen room, the students acted as both the interviewer and the Olympian to create a final broadcast video.

SCHOR STUDENTS COMPETE IN ODYSSEY OF THE MIND

On Saturday, March 3, Schor Middle School's three Odyssey of the Mind (OotM) teams traveled to Sayreville War Memorial High School to participate in first annual Gateway Regional Odyssey of the Mind tournament. This is Schor's second year participating in the international creative problem-solving competition that encourages students to explore their true potential and bring knowledge and ideas to life. OotM solutions require students to perform in both the arts and sciences. One Schor team told the tale of a formerly famous emoji by embodying three other emojis performing specific tasks. They also had to include a choreographed dance and a technical representation of texting—all without speaking. A second Schor team created a mockumentary from a classic story that included both classic and new characters, live and behind the scene action, interviews, and voiceovers. A third Schor team created a hangout in a galaxy far away that included food, three original creatures, a worker, entertainment, a futuristic map, and a quest for Space Treasure. FBLA SUCCEEDS AT STATES

After observing their robot work its way around desks and tables, the students were challenged to build a maze of desks and then an obstacle course for their robot to navigate through.
