C. AUTHORIZATION TO WITHDRAW FROM CAPITAL RESERVE

Explanation:

On March 22, 2018, the Board approved El Associates as the architect to update the Long Range Facility Plan for the Grandview Elementary School addition and for the roof replacement at Piscataway High School (Patton Building 2nd floor) project. In accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-14.1(h)1, the Board must approve the withdrawal of funds from capital reserve to fund pre-development or other pre-application costs.

WHEREAS, the Piscataway Township Board of Education has authorized the submission of the Grandview Elementary School addition and the roof replacement at Piscataway High School (Patton Building 2nd floor) project to the New Jersey Department of Education for approval as other capital projects consistent with the District's long-range facilities plan; and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-14.1(h)1 allows for the withdrawal of funds from capital reserve by board resolution to fund pre-development or other pre-application costs;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Piscataway Township Board of Education authorizes the Business Administrator to withdraw \$63,500 from capital reserve to fund the pre-development or other pre-application costs for the update of the Long Range Facility Plan for the Grandview Elementary School addition and for the roof replacement at Piscataway High School (Patton Building 2nd floor) project.

D. AUTHORIZATION FOR APPROVAL OF GRANT APPLICATION FOR 2018 SAFETY GRANT PROGRAM

Explanation:

New Jersey Schools Insurance Group has established a Safety Grant Program which will award, in 2018, a total of \$4,000,000 to its member New Jersey public school districts. The Safety Grant Program is designed to help members make safety, security and educational related purchases toward loss prevention at the individual district level which ultimately affects the health of the overall ERIC NORTH Sub fund.
