STRONG OPENING FOR PISCATAWAY SCHOOLS!

July and August may be vacation months for students and teachers, but not for the Piscataway Schools' custodial, facilities, and technology staff. This is the time when deep cleaning and facility updates take place in all buildings. This summer, in addition to painting and tile work inside, a district-wide paving project resurfaced parking lots at most of our schools and buildings. Another big project, bathrooms in the Patton Building at PHS were replaced. Parents notice the gleaming floors in all buildings on Back-to-School Nights. Thank you to all of our custodians, facilities staff, and technology staff for making sure our schools were ready on opening day!

PISCATAWAY HIGH SCHOOL "ADOPTED" BY PAPER MILL PLAYHOUSE

Piscataway High School is one of only twelve New Jersey high schools accepted into the Paper Mill Playhouse Adopt-A-School Project! Currently entering its 28th year, this four year, four phase, arts-in-education program was cited by The Kennedy Center and *Stage Directions Magazine* as one of the nation's "Top 10" arts education programs. Approximately 28 students will participate each year. The program includes tickets to Paper Mill productions with pre-performance seminars, as well as performance workshops, master classes, resident teachers, and performing opportunities. The project is fully funded by corporations, foundations, and individual donations, as well as by funds from the New Jersey State Council on the Arts. This partnership will be used in conjunction with the theatre arts coursework at Piscataway High School, and is the product of initiative and vision from Mike Yoson, theatre arts teacher at Piscataway High School. Congratulations, Mr. Yoson!

GIRL SCOUTS GO FOR THE SILVER

Girl Scouts from Troop 83279 partnered with the United Way of Central Jersey to raise awareness for its Backpack and School Supplies Giveaway. The Girl Scout Silver Award Project Team consists of Alexus Enabosi, Andrea Enabosi, Alaina Frederique and Elissa Frederique. In addition to working through the United Way, the girls collected individual supplies at various Piscataway events all summer long. Supplies were delivered to all Piscataway Elementary Schools.

QUIBBLETOWN COUNSELOR TRAVELS TO AFRICA

This summer, Quibbletown Counselor, Mawiyah Husbands traveled to Accra, Ghana, West Africa, where she visited many of Ghana's national treasures, including a Kente Village in Kumasi, the Kakum National Park, and the WEB DuBois Memorial Centre for Pan African Culture. Ms. Husbands and her group also brought school supplies to an orphanage in Accra. One of the most moving and impactful days of the trip was visiting the Cape Coast where African people were held captive by European traders before walking through the Door of No Return to be loaded on ships and sold as slaves in the Americas and Caribbean. "In the midst of tremendous grief, sadness and tears, I felt a tremendous sense of pride," said Ms. Husbands. "What a strong, brilliant, resilient people we are! We not only survived, we've thrived."

RANDOLPHVILLE'S RAJVI KAMDAR BREATHES FOR CHANGE

Over the summer, Randolphville teacher Rajvi Kamdar took part in Breathe for Change, a life-changing Yoga Certification program designed specifically for educators. This program teaches ways to incorporate yoga, mindfulness, and social emotional learning into the classroom. Ms. Kamdar spent 200 hours with fellow educators learning strategies to help students focus their minds, move their bodies, regulate their emotions, build community, express their creativity, and experience relaxation. Her grant through the Piscataway Education Foundation allows her to pass on what she has learned to her students. "I am so excited to be able to bring what I learned to the teachers and students of Piscataway so that together, we can help make this world a better place, one class at a time!"

PISCATAWAY SUMMER CAMP POSTS HIGH NUMBERS

Piscataway Summer Camp, run through the Office of Community Education, enrolled over 1000 campers in the summer of '17, quadrupling enrollment from 10 years ago. This popular program enrolls student from PreK-Grade 8 and includes activities such as swim lessons and computer coding instruction, an introduction to astronomy in the new PHS Planetarium, lots of outdoor play, and arts enrichment, including Hands-On Clay, using the kiln at PHS. New this summer, a three-hour block of theater enrichment gave campers a great introduction to the performing arts. Campers also looked forward to weekly field trips that took them to a Mets game, The Franklin Institute, Bronx Zoo, Sesame Place, Dorney Park, Digger Land, NY Hall of Science and many other fun and educational places.

DR. BROOKS' KEYNOTE SPEECH CONNECTS

Dr. Robert Brooks' staff convocation keynote speech on the themes of resilience, motivation, and school climate resonated for Conackamack staff members Joan Greenwald and Nicole (Lyon) Kragh. Ms. Kragh had attended Conackamack as a student, vividly remembers her time in Ms. Greenwald's class, and was so happy to have Ms. Greenwald serve as her mentor when she began her own teaching career. During Dr. Brooks' presentation, Ms. Kragh told Mr. Greenwald, "You were my charismatic adult," referring to Brooks' term for a teacher who brings energy and dedication to her students each and every day.

On the first day of class this year, Ms. Greenwald encouraged her students to take ownership of the classroom, giving each a voice to contribute to a number of questions and statements. After gathering their input, she displayed a chart for all to see and to serve as a reminder that we are a community in search of our best selves. What a wonderful testament to the work of both of these teachers here in Piscataway.

ASSEMBLYMAN DANIELSEN DONATES BACKPACKS AND SCHOOL SUPPLIES

Assemblyman Joe Danielsen, along with representatives from Enterprise Car Rental and the Piscataway Elks, delivered 150 backpacks filled with school supplies for students in Piscataway schools. Students and administrators were on hand to thank Assemblyman Danielsen and his partners for their generous donation.

TWO NEW CLASSROOMS OPEN AT CHILDREN'S CORNER POND

Demand for high-quality, affordable preschool has led to the opening of two new classrooms at Children's Corner Preschool by the Pond. These two classrooms allow the District to enroll an additional 40 PreK students, ensuring their smooth transition to kindergarten. This brings the total enrollment at both preschool campuses to 501 students, a jump from 303 students enrolled in the 2012-2013 school year. This includes 70 children enrolled in the Infant/Toddler program, which began in 2011-2012, with just 12 toddlers. Both Children's Corner by the River and Children's Corner by the Pond now employ full-time nurses.

SUPERCHIEF BAND FESTIVAL ON SEPTEMBER 23, 2017

The 40th Annual Superchief Band Festival is scheduled for Saturday, September 23, 2017 at the high school. Sponsored by USBands, this year's competition will host 17 high school marching bands in competitive

categories of Music Individual, Visual Performance, General Effect, Ensemble Analysis, Color Guard, and Percussion. This year, the Piscataway Superchiefs show "War of the Worlds," combines two classic works: the radio show "War of the Worlds" by Orson Wells, one of the greatest and most successful media "spoofs" of all times, and Gustav Holst's "The Planets," one of the most popular and recognizable pieces of classical music. The combination of these two works is a perfect interstellar marriage. The event is hosted by the Piscataway High School Band Parents Association (PHSBPA) and the High School Instrumental Program, led by Dr. Christopher G. Sumner and Kenneth Zampella, Piscataway High School Band Directors. Proceeds benefit Piscataway High School band ensembles.

PISCATAWAY EDUCATION FOUNDATION GRANT AWARDS 16 TEACHER GRANTS

The Piscataway Education Foundation announced recipients of this year's "Inspire Grants" at the District Convocation. Forty-nine grant applications were received this year, and funding decisions were difficult. Ultimately, sixteen teachers spanning preschool through high school received grants for innovative teaching practices and non-traditional teaching methods.
